We are all aware of the need to mitigate the risk of infection. Consequently, the world of access control has been impacted too. Not only do wireless technologies add value in terms of usage, but they can also help to effectively reduce the risk of contagion too.

No more need for keypads or traditional biometrics that use fingerprints! We were already one step ahead of this development when we dematerialised access badges in smartphones and introduced authentication technologies, such as facial recognition or smartphone-based biometrics. No more need to touch the access control reader!

You recently joined forces with Nedap on the access control market. What shape does this collaboration take?

VD: This partnership primarily focuses on integrating STid's high-security expertise into the Nedap AEOS-proposition. We have a shared ambition: we want to provide organisations with the best possible solutions to protect their people and strategic assets.

The integration of our propositions is seamless. We are planning on building a new common solution based on the best of both worlds to help organisations confront the new security challenges they are facing.

What's the next step?

VD: To continue to grow by proposing solutions that simplify and protect users' daily lives! There is a multitude of jossibilities. Imagining new modes of identification, continuously improving the ergonomics of our solutions, etc. We will carry on working every day to make access control ever more instinctive and secure!
